STATEMENT OF INTENT

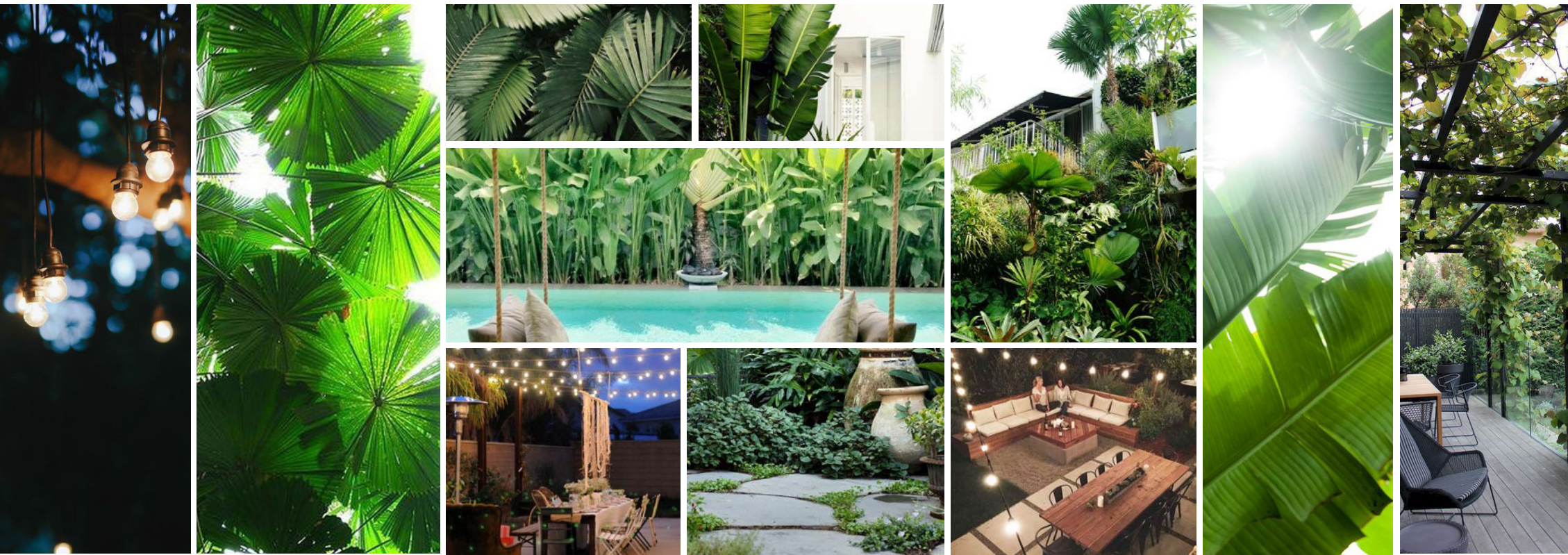
The Aura community will provide a landscape setting that is relaxing, cool, peaceful and secure.

A sub-tropical planting palette will ensure the landscape celebrates the surrounding Sunshine Coast environment ensuring the site connects with its context. Planting will be low maintenance whilst showcasing an attractive and visually appealing outdoor environment.

Residents and visitors will connect through the site under the natural shade of street trees within a broader landscape that is lush and vibrant. Feature species will be positioned to accentuate, frame and disguise.

Verdant climbers, creepers, and sprawling groundcovers in natural ground, pot, and hanging plants will frame the bold architectural forms of the community centre, providing an ideal location for outdoor dining and community interaction. Feature festoon lighting will provide ambience whilst ensuring the outdoors are utilised after dark when the hot and sometimes dry conditions of the Sunshine Coast.

PRINCIPLES

ELEGANCE



The landscape will exude elegance and sophistication regardless of its intended informality. Passive and active open space areas will integrate with and respond to the elegance of the architecture complementing the built form - not competing against it.

SUB-TROPICAL



Bold lines and shapes will still remain within the structure of the master plan but this character will be contrasted by an organic overlay. The spaces inbetween will offer areas of relief and moments of respite for residents.

FLEXIBLE



The relatively simple architectural and landscape forms will be enriched, adorned, and embellished with temporal landscaping and furniture elements ensuring flexibility of use and purpose.

SOCIAL



Planting design that supports climate responsive architecture will offer a place for conversation, meeting friends and family, and outdoor gathering in a centralised clubhouse. Residents will move freely and comfortably within the site enjoying the outdoor lifestyle afforded by the Sunshine Coast's unique climate.

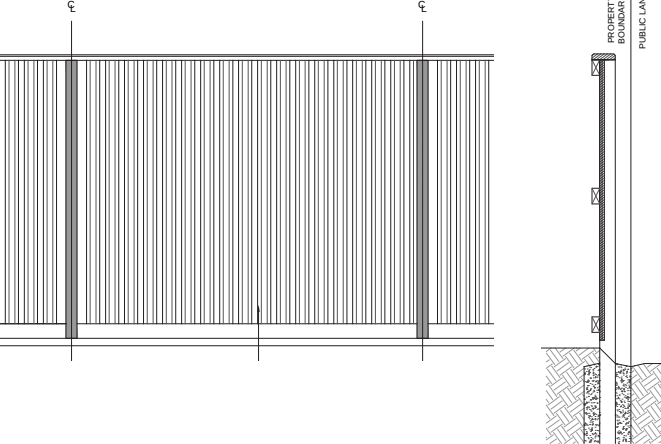

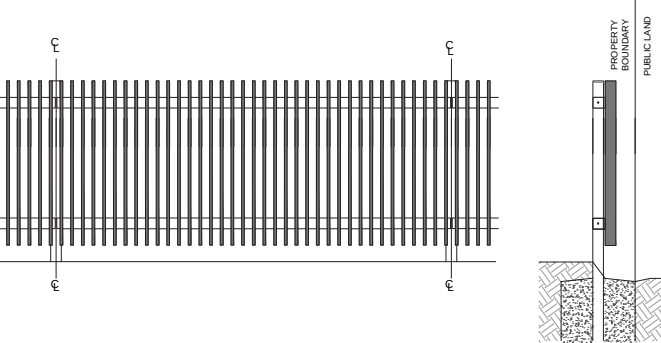

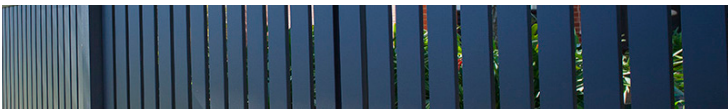

SOFTSCAPE

The planting of Aura will be dense, reminiscent of the coastal Caloundra's natural setting.

The planting approach will create a gardenesque feeling with dense clumps of feature tropical planting.

The planting strategy will apply a combination of unique species selected for their ability to enhance the overall vitality and place character.

Plant selection will not be solely based on ornamental qualities, but generate a sense of identity and comfort, taking cues from the surrounding environment.

Planting provides elements of screening, scale and colour that support function and complement the built form character of the Community Centre.

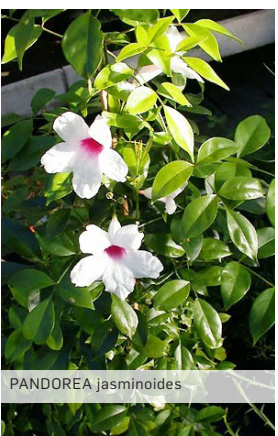

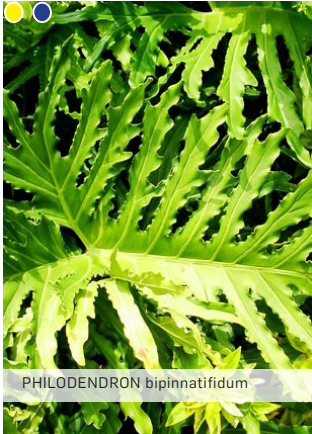

The design and application of materials throughout the landscape will be characterised by a simple palette including natural stone, timber, and contrasting wall renders that tie into the overall architectural design.



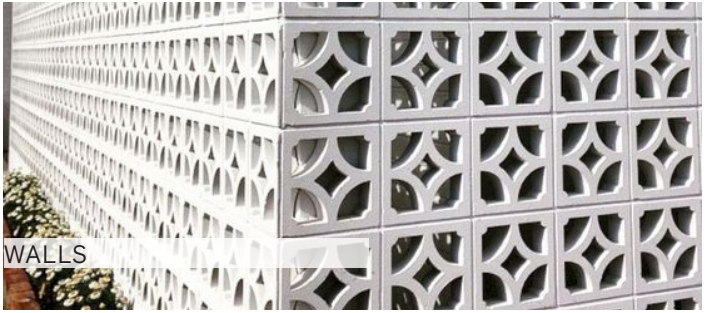

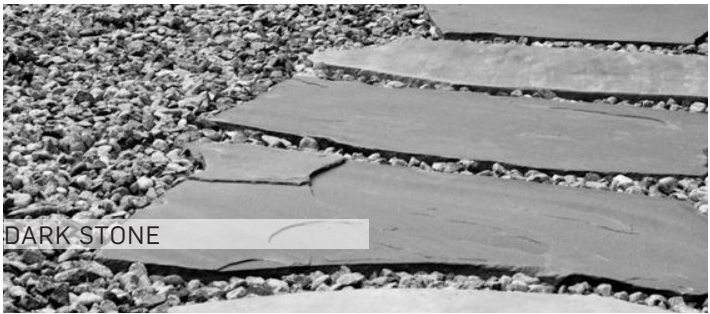
